

FROM THE PRESIDENT

First thing on the list of "to do's", is to thank all the business's who advertised in our newsletter. We all should seek those people out when we need their services.

Secondly, I have been in contact with the Superintendent of Schools for Northland High School, Mr. Mike Doro. I explained that we would provide two fully paid scholarships (up to \$350 each) to educate young adults in environmenteal responsibilities. I also explained that the scholarships would be offered to Lake Washburn Association members FIRST, and if no interest, we would honor the two names that he provided. You will probably get a fair amount of information from Gary Ahlquist, but I want to add my own plug. We have the interest of the County Extension Office to aid us in lakeshore landscaping. Donna and I have been a few of the volunteers to offer lakeshore to renovate. Our newsletter....unfortunately this year it has been extremely hard to deliver the first two issues on time. There's no apology here, just a statement that we all could have done better. We need everybody's input. Have you seen an interesting article, or have a picture of Washburn you would like to share? Everybody's input is invited and welcomed. For 2002, I have taken the responsibility of collecting the materials for the newsletter.

There's a possibility that County 48 blocks natural flowage. I'm attempting, thru county, state and federal authorities to see if the southern tip of East Lake should have flowage into the bog area on the south side of County 48. If this is true, maybe we can get a culvert installed under County 48. But's it's also possible the flowage is from the bog to the lake, but we won't know unless we ask!

Dry wells for fire safety...a subject we haven't forgotten, it's just hit red tape. So we will communicate with Lenny Lang from time to time, and we'll report to you any major changes.

Don't forget to join our association in 2002, and you can rquest an area you would like to help with when paying your dues.

HELP PROTECT WATER QUALITY

One of the best ways you can protect a lake's water quality is by implementing the best management practices (BMPs) in the near shore area. These activities help control nonpoint source pollution and reduce the amounts of soils and nutrients entering the lake.

Here are seven great shoreland BMPs for lake protection:

- ** Use "Phosphorus Free" fertilizers only as needed and don't fertilize along the shoreline.
- ** Septic systems should be properly maintained and currently up to code.
- ** Do NOT deposit grass clippings or leaves in the lake or storm sewers.
- ** Encourage woody vegetation and tall grasses (buffer strips) to stablilize the shoreline and prevent runoff.
- ** Always maintain natural vegetation when possible or slow shoreland runoff with gentle slopes or terrace landscaping.
- ** Minimize disturbance and removal of aquatic plants as they are vital to the health of the lake and fisheries.
- ** Work with local officials to ensure that the local water plan contains protective and restorative management efforts for your lake.

In the year 2000, 820 lakes in Minnesota were tested and Washburn was 186th, which put our lake in the upper 24%. Water height, lack of rainfall, and temperatures all influence water clarity.

EXOTIC SPECIES STILL POSE THREAT TO LAKES, RIVERS

If anglers and boaters don't do more to prevent the spread of exotics -- like removing plants from boats and draining livewells before leaving a lake -- then Minnesota's fish populations and fishing are bound to suffer.

Harmful aquatic animal and plant species such as the zebra mussel and spiny water flea increasingly threaten to permanently harm Minnesota's fish populations and fishing itself. Zebra mussels, which consume food at the base of the food chain, recently invaded one of Minnesota's inland waters, Lake Zumbro, near Rochester, MN, for the first time. Spiny water fleas are now clogging fishing tackle Lake Superior charters. These and other species could displace native fish species and alter the food chain that supports game fish.

Help prevent the spread of exotics by checking your boat each time you take it out of a lake, river or stream.







ELECTROFISHING RESULTS

Night electrofishing is done yearly on Lake Washburn in September as part of our participation in the 5 year no stocking program. This helps determine the success of natural reproduction of young-of-year walleye.

2000 electrofishing was done the evening of Sept, 12, for a total of 1.9 hours of shocking time. The water temperature was 65 and conditions were perfect. A total of **eight** walleye were captured for a catch rate of 4.2 fish per hour. No young-of- year were captured. Seven of the eight walleye observed were from the 1999 year class (age 1) and the one other fish was from the 1995 year (age 5). The 1999 year class ranged in size from 189 mm to 215 mm. The strong year class of 1999 observed during last years electroshocking did not appear in large numbers this year which may be due to the young-of-year being on the skinny side and condition factors were poor in 1999. Growth rate for the 1999 year class in 2000 was a little slow.

Numerous small (under 20 inches) northern pike and fairly high numbers of perch were observed. Perch were observed in low numbers in 1999. Largemouth bass and blue gill were common in abundance. Results of the September, 2001, electrofishing will be available in the spring of 2002.

HYDRO LAB UPDATE

Four times a year a technician from Cass County comes to Lake Washburn to measure for water temperature, dissolved oxygen, phosphorous levels and conductivity.

What is Conductivity? It is a measure of man-made pollution in the water. We have participated in this process for three years and are building a base to see any changes that may occur and possibly catch changes before they progress to far.

A measurement is also done of Sechi disk readings. The 2001 spring measurement was different from previous years. On North Lake in 2000 year the reading was 14 feet, this year, possibly due to high water and erosion, the measurement was 10 feet. In Birch Bay the reading went from 12 feet in 2000 to 8 feet this year. Oxygen level was less in the Birch Bay area, possibly because of fertilizers and human exposures. More tests will be done this year. Results should be available next February.

This information was presented by Dave Snesrud at the August 11 general meeting.


